

MyAccess Clinics Cookie Policy

Last updated: 13 January 2021

This Cookie Policy explains how MMJ Clinic Group Limited (Company Number 11906622) t/a MyAccess Clinics (**we, us** or **our**) use cookies and similar technologies to recognise you when you visit our websites including those accessed through the domain name myaccessclinics.co.uk or any other website which references this Cookie Policy (collectively, **Websites**). It explains what these technologies are and why we use them, as well as your rights to control our use of them.

What are cookies?

Cookies are small data files that are placed on your computer or mobile device when you visit a website. Cookies are widely used by website owners in order to make their websites work, or to work more efficiently, as well as to provide reporting information.

Cookies set by the website owner are called ‘first party cookies’. Cookies set by parties other than the website owner are called ‘third party cookies’. Third party cookies enable third party features or functionality to be provided on or through the website (e.g. advertising, interactive content and analytics). The parties that set these third-party cookies can recognise your computer both when it visits the website in question and also when it visits certain other websites.

Why do we use cookies?

We use first party and third-party cookies for several reasons. Some cookies are required for technical reasons in order for the Websites to operate, and we refer to these as ‘essential’ or ‘strictly necessary’ cookies. Other cookies also enable us to track and target the interests of our users to enhance the experience on the Websites. Third parties may serve cookies through the Websites for advertising, analytics and other purposes. This is described in more detail below.

The specific types of first and third party cookies served through the Websites and the purposes they perform are described in the table below:

<p>Analytics and customisation cookies: These cookies collect information that is used either in aggregate form to help us understand how the Websites are being used or how effective are marketing campaigns are, or to help us customise the Websites for you.</p>	<p>myaccessclinics.co.uk analytics.google.com</p>	<p>To refuse these cookies, please follow the instructions below under the heading “How can I control cookies?”</p>
<p>Advertising cookies: These cookies are used to make advertising messages more relevant to you. They perform functions like preventing the same ad from continuously reappearing, ensuring that ads are properly displayed for advertisers, and in some cases selecting advertisements that are based on your interests.</p>	<p>myaccessclinics.co.uk analytics.google.com</p>	<p>To refuse these cookies, please follow the instructions below under the heading “How can I control cookies?”</p>
<p>Social networking cookies: These cookies are used to enable you to share pages and content that you find interesting on the Websites through third party social networking and other websites. What about other tracking technologies, like web beacons?

Cookies are not the only way to recognise or track visitors to a website. We may use other, similar technologies from time to time, like web beacons (sometimes called ‘tracking pixels’ or ‘clear gifs’). These are tiny graphics files that contain a unique identifier that enable us to recognise when someone has visited the Websites or opened an e-mail that we have sent them. This allows us, for example, to monitor the traffic patterns of users from one page within the Websites to another, to deliver or communicate with cookies, to understand whether you have come to the Websites from an online advertisement displayed on a third-party website, to improve site performance, and to measure the success of e-mail marketing campaigns. In

many instances, these technologies are reliant on cookies to function properly, and so declining cookies will impair their functioning.

Flash cookies or Local Shared Objects

The Websites may also use so-called 'Flash Cookies' (also known as Local Shared Objects or 'LSOs') to, among other things, collect and store information about your use of our services, fraud prevention and for other site operations.

If you do not want Flash Cookies stored on your computer, you can adjust the settings of your Flash player to block Flash Cookies storage using the tools contained in the [Website Storage Settings Panel](#). You can also control Flash Cookies by going to the [Global Storage Settings Panel](#) and following the instructions (which may include instructions that explain, for example, how to delete existing Flash Cookies (referred to 'information' on the Macromedia site), how to prevent Flash LSOs from being placed on your computer without your being asked, and (for Flash Player 8 and later) how to block Flash Cookies that are not being delivered by the operator of the page you are on at the time).

Please note that setting the Flash Player to restrict or limit acceptance of Flash Cookies may reduce or impede the functionality of some Flash applications, including, potentially, Flash applications used in connection with our services or online content.

Targeted advertising

Third parties may serve cookies on your computer or mobile device to serve advertising through the Websites. These companies may use information about your visits to the Website and other websites in order to provide relevant advertisements about goods and services that you may be interested in. They may also employ technology that is used to measure the effectiveness of advertisements. This can be accomplished by them using cookies or web beacons to collect information about your visits to the Website and other websites in order to provide relevant advertisements about goods and services of potential interest to you. The information collected through this process does not enable us or them to identify your name, contact details or other personally identifying details unless you choose to provide these.

How can I control cookies?

You have the right to decide whether to accept or reject cookies.

You can set or amend your web browser controls to accept or refuse cookies. If you choose to reject cookies, you may still use the Websites though your access to some functionality and areas of the Websites may be restricted. As the means by which you can refuse cookies through your web browser controls vary from browser-to-browser, you should visit your browser's help menu for more information.
